Student Parking 2019 - 2020

Academic Parking Permits:

Always properly display permits (hang from rearview mirror). Permits valid August 15, 2019 through May 10, 2020.

Summer parking permits valid May 11, 2020 through August 14, 2020.

Permits are non-transferable.

Rams Head Deck/RD zone

Display of **both** hanging permit and window decal for Rams Head deck/ RD zone required.

Event Operations

UNC Transportation & Parking reserves the right to close specific parking lots for events.

Please visit www.move.unc.edu for parking information, zone location and events on parking.

Attention: Class status and Resident/ Commuter status will be verified. Ineligible students that received permits must return the permit.



Weeknight Parking

Student daytime parking permits are honored in weeknight lots after 5:00 pm unless the lot is reserved for event operations. Entrance lot signs indicate enforcement hours of the lot.

Vehicles must be moved from the lot by 7:30 am the next day if parking in a different lot.

Students (except first-year undergraduates) without a daytime parking permit may register for weeknight parking using the Online Services portal at move.unc.edu. Vehicle license plate and proof of insurance required; no additional fee. Permission to park for weeknight is virtual (no physical permit).

P2P Services

The P2P Express offers free transportation to all students and employees seven days a week from 7:00 pm until 4:00 am during the spring, fall and summer semesters (except when residence halls are closed).

P2P shuttle provides service for disabled students, students going to the Campus Health Services Center, and after dark to all students NOT served by the Express route (to and from "open" campus buildings only). It also provides transportation to and from remote on-campus parking lots and the RR lot off campus. For more information, please visit www.move.unc.edu/P2P.

Safe Ride

Safe Ride is a student-run program that aims to improve the general safety at UNC by working with local public safety and transportation agencies to provide increased mobility during late-night hours (11 pm - 2:30 am) both on campus and off.

U and Reverse U (RU) Routes

Chapel Hill Transit bus routes, including the U and RU, are fare-free and accessible to persons with mobility impairments. The U and RU have stops that allow riders to reach any point on main campus within a two-minute walk. They circle main campus (in opposite directions) on weekdays from 7 am - 8 pm. Maximum waiting time: fifteen minutes.


Parking Tips



- Do buy a permit, if available.
- Do park only in spaces designated by the permit.
- Do display permit as directed.
- Do report lost or stolen permits to Parking Services.
- Do allow enough time to find a parking space and have a back-up plan. The purchase of a parking permit does not guarantee a parking space.
- Do check the signs, before you park. All lots have signs indicating the type of permit required.
- Do contact Parking Control immediately if your vehicle becomes disabled on campus and you are unable to move it. For motor assistance, you will need your license plate number and where you are parked.
- Do inform yourself of all parking rules and regulations. If you have a question about parking, don't ask your Residence Assistant, your roommate, your friends or your mom. ASK TRANSPORTATION & PARKING.
- Do park in operative meters only.
- Do arrive early. The most convenient parking spaces fill up quickly.
- Do update vehicles using the Online Services portal at move.unc.edu.

- Don't alter any type of parking permit.
- Don't attempt to duplicate or counterfeit any type of parking permit.
- Don't park in undesignated areas.
- Don't ignore posted signs.
- Don't park in disability spaces without proper permits.



RR PERMIT HOLDERS

The RR student lot is located off of Estes Drive approximately 2 miles from main campus. A valid UNC One Card is required to access the pedestrian and vehicular gates. Contact Parking Services if gate card access has not been activated. The NU bus route serves this location. The route information can be found at www.chtransit.org.

STUDENT FAMILY HOUSING

Student Family Housing (SFH) permits are assigned by building location and are valid only for that area and for weeknight parking. SFH permits expire at the end of the permit year.
