



Guiding Principles


- <u>Guiding Principle 1</u>: Provide adequate and safe access for all who need to come to campus.

The 5-Year Plan has four guiding principles that represent the goals and values of Transportation and Parking at UNC. The four guiding principles are:


- I. Provide adequate and safe access for all who need to come to campus

Feb.-June 2023


